printf() is a predefined standard C function for printing the output on standard output device such as screen (console) and printer.

scanf() is used to take input from keyboard by the user.

b) Give the syntax of do-while statement.(2M)

Syntax:

```

c) Syntax to declare two Dimensional array(2M)

The array which is used to represent and store data in a tabular form is called as two dimensional array. Such type of array is specially used to represent data in a matrix form. Declaration and initialization of two dimensional array:

Syntax :-

Data type arrayname [row size] [column size];



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d) Differentiate between call by value and call by reference(Any two points, 2M)

Call by value	Call by reference
1. When function is called by passing values then it is call by value.	1. When function is called by passing address of variable then it is called as call by reference.
2. Copy of actual variable is created when function is called.	2. No copy is generated for actual variable rather address of actual variable is passed.
3. In call by value, memory required is more as copy of variable is created.	3. In call by reference, memory required is less as there is no copy of actual variables.
4.Example:- Function call - Swap (x,y); Calling swap function by passing values.	4.Example:- Function call – Swap (&x, &y); Calling swap function by passing address.
5. Original (actual) parameters do not change. Changes take place on the copy of variable.	5. Actual parameters change as function operates on value stored at the address.

Pointer is a variable which stores the address of another variable.

where n is an integer variable, which receives the value of the length of the string.

struct book b={2,"PIC","Balgurusamy",450.00};

b) What is array? How to declare and initialize array? Explain.

An array is a fixed size sequence collection of elements of similar data types which share a common name. It is simply grouping of same type of data which can be accessed by a common name. (2M)

Declaration of Array: (1M)



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Considering array of 5 integer elements:

```
int a[5];
```

Initialization of an array of 5 elements :

An array can be either initialized at design time or runtime.

1. Design time initialization (1M)

(Considering an array of 5 integers)

```
int num[5]={ 1,3,4,10,12};
```

2. Run time initialization

This requires some loop statement for repeating input to all locations of an array.

```
Eg.int num[5];
```

```
int i; for(i=0; i<5; i++)
```

```
{  
scanf(“%d”, &num[i]);  
}
```

- Any other data type of array can be considered.
- Any one method out of two for initialization can be considered.

c) **Explain any two string functions.(Any 2, each 2 marks)**

strcat():- This function joins two strings together. The contents of 2nd string argument are added at the end of first string.

Syntax: strcat (string1, string2);

```
e.g. char word[20], word1[5];
```

```
word=”ABC”;
```

```
word1=”Company”;
```

```
strcat(word1,word2);
```

Output: word1=ABCCompany

word2=Company 2.

2.strcmp():- This function compares two strings identified by arguments and returns zero if both strings are equal, otherwise it returns the difference between ASCII values of first non matching character pair from the strings.

Syntax: strcmp (string1, string2);

```
strcmp (“there”, “their”)= difference between r & e
```

3. strlen():- It can be used to get the length of the string. It uses string argument which is name of character array. It returns an integer showing no. of characters from the string excluding last ‘\0’ (null character).

Syntax:

```
intVariable_name=strlen(string name);
```

4. strcpy() :- This function accepts two string arguments and as a result contents of string2 are copied in string1.

```
Ex. char s1[20]={“ABC”};
```

```
char s2[8]={“Company”};
```

```
strcpy(s1,s2)
```

Output: s1=Company s2=Company



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d) Explain the recursive functions with example. (explanation - 2 M, example 2M)

Recursion is a process of function calling itself again and again. A recursive function contains function call to itself in the body of function. Recursive function can be effectively used to solve problems where solution is expressed in terms of successively applying the same solution to subsets of problem. When recursive function is written, an if statement should be there in the body of function to force the function to return to calling function without the recursive call being executed. If statement is not included then function will never return.

Ex: recursive function for calculating factorial of a no.

```
int factorial ( int no)
{
    if ( no==1)
    return 1;
    else
    return (no * factorial ( no -1));
}
```

Any other recursive function example can be written & considered.

e) Distinguish between variable and constant.(any four point ,4M)

Variable	Constant
Value of Variable can be changed at any time throughout the program.	Constant variable are the variables whose value once assigned cannot be changed throughout the program.
Variable are declared along with its data type	Variable can be declared using 'const' key word.
Syntax: <data type><variable name>	Syntax: const<data type> <variable name>
Eg: int a;	Eg: const float pi=3.14

f) Explain '*' and '&' operators used with pointers.(explanation 2M, example 2M)

& (ampersand) operator can be used to determine address of any variable.

*(asterisk) operator can be used to display value of the pointer variable that is original value

```
void main()
{
int i=10,*p;
p=&i;
printf("value is":-,*p);
}
```

Output: 10

b) Explain structure in C with suitable example.(structure definition & explanation 2M, syntax of declaration 1M, example 1 M)

A structure is a collection of one or more variables of same or different data types grouped together under a single name.

Declaration of structure:

Syntax:

struct structure _name
{
    Data_type member1;
    Data_type member2;
    Data_type member n;
}variable;
```

Example

```
struct book
{
int book_id;
char title[20];
char author[20];
float price;
}b;
```

**c) Write a program to find the length of the string.
(2M – correct logic, 2M correct Syntax)**

d) Explain use of if else statement(use 1M, syntax 1M, example 2M)

If else statement is used for decision making. It is used to control flow of execution of statement.

Syntax:-

```
if(test expression)
{
    True block statement
}
else
{
    False block statement
}
```

If the test expression is true then the true block statement, immediately following the if ,statements are executed.

If the test expression is false then the false block statement, immediately following the else, statements are executed.

Example:

```
int num;
num=2;
if(num<0)
{
printf("num is negative");
}
else
{
printf("num is positive");
}
```



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```
}  
num is greater than 0 so false block statement will be executed.
```

- e) Write a program to accept ten member in and print average of it.
(2M – correct Logic, 2M correct syntax)

```
#include<stdio.h>  
#include<conio.h>  
void main()  
{  
int a[10],avg,sum=0,i;  
clrscr();  
printf("\n Enter number");  
for(i=0;i<10;i++)  
scanf("%d",&a[i]);  
for(i=0;i<10;i++)  
sum=sum+a[i];  
avg=sum/10;  
printf("Avg=%d",avg);  
getch();  
}
```

- f) Write program to find whether a number even or odd.
Note: any other logic can be consider
(2M – correct Logic, 2M correct syntaxes)

int no;  
clrscr();  
printf("Enter a number:");  
scanf("%d",&no);  
if(no%2==0)  
{  
printf("\nNumber is even");  
}  
else  
{ printf("\nNumber is odd");  
}  
getch();  
}
```

- a) State use of increment and decrement operators with examples.(use of operator 1M each, example 1M each)

Increment operator:

Use: Increment operator (++) is a unary operator. It operates on one operand. It is used to increment value of a variable by 1.

Example:



```
int a=6;
a++;
printf("\n%d",a);
```

In above example initially value of a is 6. due to increment operator (++) value of a will be incremented by 1. So output value of a will be 7.

Decrement operator:

Use: Decrement operator (--) is an unary operator. It operates on one operand. It is used to decrement value of a variable by 1.

Example:

```
int a=6;
a--;
printf("\n%d",a);
```

In above example initially value of a is 6. due to decrement operator (--) value of a will be decremented by 1. So output value of a will be 5.

b) Explain initialization of one dimensional of array.(explanation 2M; example 2M)

Compile time initialization: an array is initialized when it is declared.

Syntax initialization of one dimensional of array:

```
datatype array_name[size]={list of values};
```

Example: `int number[3]={1,2,3};`

The above statement will declare variable number as an array of size 3 and will assign specified values to each element.

Run time initialization: an array is initialized explicitly at run time that is after declaration initialization is done separately.

Example:

```
Int a[3], i;
For(i=0; i<3; i++)
Scanf("%d",&a[i]);
```

(any one type of initialization can be considered)

c) Explain pointer arithmetic with example.

(02-marks for explanation, 02-marks for example)

Explanation:

Pointer arithmetic is concerned with the arithmetic operations with the pointers. Like basic operation +, -, *, / can be done using pointer notation.

Some of the following operations are possible:

```
e.g. add = *p1 + *p2
y= *p1 -*p2
x= *p1 / *p2
```



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Example:

```
#include<stdio.h>
#include<conio.h>
void main()
{
int a=10,b=2,sum,mul;
int *p1,*p2;
clrscr();
p1=&a;
p2=&b;
sum=*p1+*p2;
mul=*p1**p2;
printf("\nAddition=%d\nMultiplication=%d",sum,mul);
getch();
}
```

d) Explain pointer expressions. Explain meaning of (*pl)++ with example.(pointer expression 2M, meaning of (*pl)++ 2M)

A pointer expression contains pointer variable as an operand and arithmetic operators such as +, -, *, /

Example:

```
x=*p1+*p2
```

(*pl) :-pl is a pointer variable.*pl indicates value stored at the memory address present inside pointer pl.

(*pl)++ :- This statement increments value, stored at the memory address pointed by pointer pl, by 1.

```
#include<stdio.h>
#include<conio.h>
void main()
{
int a,*pl;
a=2;
pl=&a;
printf("\n%d",(*pl)++);-> displays output as 2
printf("\n%d",(*pl));-> displays output as 3
getch();
}
```

e) Differentiate while and do while statement.

Any other valid difference can be considered. Each difference 1 M (4 Diff.)

While loop	do while loop
1. Syntax: while (expression) { Statements }	syntax: do { Statements } while (expression);
2. while loop checks the condition first and then	do while loop first executes statements and then checks the condition.



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executes statements.	
3. If expression is true then only statements inside block are executed otherwise loop terminates.	If expression is false then also at least once statements inside block are executed.
4. Example: a=1; while (a<0) { printf (“%d”,a); a = a+1; }	a = 1; do { printf(“%d”,a); a = a+1; }while(a<0);

f) **What is function prototype? Explain with example. (function prototype explanation 2M, example 2M)**

Function prototype is a function declaration before it is invoked. It consists of function return type, function name, parameter list and terminating semicolon.

Syntax:

Function_type function_name(parameter list);

function_type specifies the data type of value that the function is expected to return to the calling function.

Function name specifies a unique identity of the defined function in the program.

Parameter list declares the variables that will receive data sent by calling function. They act as input to the function.

Example:

void display(int a)

```
{  
printf(“%d”,a);  
}
```

Above function does not return any value as its function type is void. Name of the function is display. This function accepts 1 int value from the calling function and stores it in variable a. Inside the function body value of a is display on the screen.

a) **Write to read two strings and find whether they are equal or not equal (Logic 2 marks syntax 2marks)**

```

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b) Describe use of break and continue statement with example.

(Explanation 2 M, Examples – 2Marks)

Break: It breaks the execution of the loop which allows exiting from any loop or switch, such that break statement skips the remaining part of current iterations of the loop.

Syntax: break;

Continue: It is used when it is required to skip the remaining portion of the loop without breaking loop it will transfer control directly to next iteration

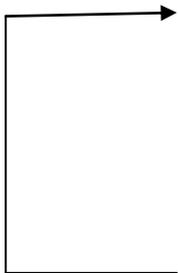
Syntax: continue;

Note:- In example any other correct example is also considerable)

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in given program sequence if 'break' executes then execution control will jump out of loop & next statement after loop i.e. statement y will be executed.

in given program sequence if 'continue' executes then execution control will skip remaining statements of loop & will start next iteration of loop

c) Write program to determine the string is palindrome or not.

(Logic 2 marks syntax 2marks)

note:- character by character comparison logic is also valid)

```
#include<stdio.h>
#include<string .h>
#include<conio.h>
void main ()
{
char str1[20],str2[20];
clrscr();
printf("enter string which to be checked");
scanf("%s",str1);
strcpy(str2,str1);
strrev(str2);
if(strcmp(str1,str2)==0)
printf("string is palindrome ");
else
printf("string is not palindrome ");
getch();
}
```

d) Explain concept of Array of characters with example.

(Explanation 2 marks example 2 marks)

Character array is collection of values arranged in sequential manner in memory. Contents of character array can be accessed or filled as one character at a time or entire string at once.

Declaration of character array:- character array declaration can be done as follow

char array_name[size_of_array];

here size_of_array specify maximum no of elements which we can store in array. In compile time initialization size field can be kept blank .If character array stores string then it is ended with '\0'.

Initialization of character array :- character array can be initialized at compile time or run time .

Accessing character array: - character array elements can be accessed character by character using format specifier %c & as whole string using format specifier %s .

Ex: char myarray[10]={'a','e','i','o','u'};

here character array myarr of size 10 is declared & initialized with members 'a','e','i','o','u'

a	e	i	o	u
1000	1001	1002	1003	1004



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- e) Explain No-Argument-No-Return value function type with example.
(Explanation 2 marks example 2 marks)

In this category of function, function does not take any input & it also does not provide any return value to caller of function.



syntax of declaration:-

void function_name(void);



example:-

```
#include<stdio.h>
void myfun(void);
void main()
{
myfun()
}
void myfun(void)
{
printf("hello");
}
```

In given example function myfun() does not take any input or provide any return value

- f) Explain problem-solving techniques in detail. (List 1 Mark, explanation 3 Marks)

algorithm

flowchart

Pseudo-code

Algorithm :- a process or set of rules to be followed in calculations or other problem-solving operations, especially by a computer.

Flowchart:- a graphical representation of a computer program in relation to its sequence of functions and operations. (as distinct from the data it processes).

Pseudocode :- is an informal high-level description of the operating principle of a computer program or other algorithm.

Function declaration (function prototyping):- this statement specifies to compiler details of user defined functions

The details specified by declaration statement are return type, name of function, parameter list with their data type

Syntax :-

Return type name_of_function(data type para-1, data type para-2....., data type para-N);

Ex.

printf("enter radius%d",&r);
scanf("%d",&r);
area(r);
}

{
float a;

}
```

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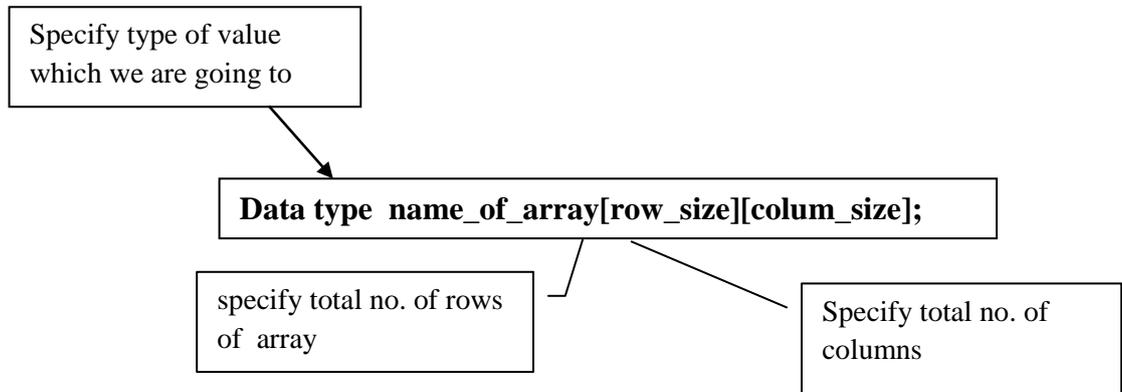
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- e) Explain two dimensional array with example.(Explanation 2 marks example 2 marks)

It is collection of constants of same data type arranged in sequentially in column & row manner.

Declaration of Two dimension array: - array declaration is statement which is used for creating array. Array is declared similar to other primary variable. 2-D array declaration is done as follow



ex. int arr[3][2] - here array of type integer having 3 rows and 2 column is declared. Initializing array (one dimension array):- array initialization means inserting values in array. There are two methods of array initialization

- 1) Compile time initialization
- 2) Run time array initialization

intmy_array[3][2]={ {1,2}, {3,4}, {5,6} };		column -0	column-1
	row - 0	1	2
	row- 1	3	4
	row- 2	5	6

- f) Explain any two logical operators with example.(explanation 2 marks example two marks)note:- any two operators can be considered)

Operator	Syntax	Working	Example
&&	Argument 1 && argument2	This operator will check logical value of argument 1 and argument 2 And if logical values of both argument is true then it will give output 1(true) otherwise will return zero.	a=5 ,b=4,c=3,d=1 (a>b)&&(c>d) This will give output1 as both of its arguments a>b and c>d are having logical value 1
